School Uniform

The school does have a uniform. The colours for all years except Year 6 are red and grey. White polo shirts are worn under red sweatshirts or cardigans. We would ask that the boys wear grey trousers and the girls grey skirts or pinafore dresses. It is also considered suitable for the girls to wear trousers/playsuits. Children should wear sensible black school shoes. We do not allow trainers or boots to be worn for school. We would ask that all parents ensure that their children conform to the school colours. We do have sweatshirts on which the school name and logo are embroidered. These can be purchased from the office.

Year 6 children receive two free blue sweatshirts/cardigans once they sign a behaviour agreement. School also provides summer blue polo shirts. Year 6 girls can wear blue check summer dresses or playsuits.

Hair

We would also ask that haircuts are sensible and we actively discourage lines etc. shaved into hairstyles. Long hair must always be tied back.

Make up

Children are asked not to wear nail varnish, false nails or any other make up (including shimmering/coloured lip balm).

Jewellery

Children are not allowed to wear jewellery, as it is against health and safety guidelines and increases the risk of loss or damage to personal belongings

PE and Games

All children are expected to take part in PE and games and will only be excused on production of a note from their parents.

All our children are expected to do P.E. in their bare feet. They should wear black shorts and white T-shirt.

*For **Outdoor games**, all children must bring a change of clothing. They may wear tracksuits (in cold weather) and trainers. Key Stage 2 children have the opportunity to go swimming. Swimming costumes for girls and trunks for boys must be provided. Swimming caps must be worn by all children. Goggles are not permitted unless your child has a medical letter from the GP.*
