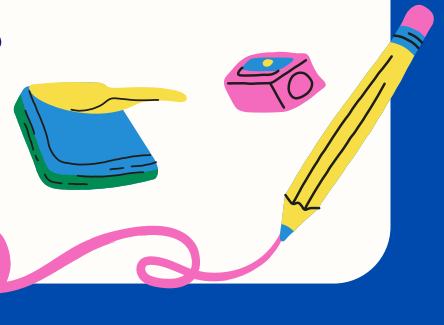

INGENIOUS

Yesterday the Year 5s were joined by some Engineering Ambassadors from Salford University who were working for a company called Ingenious. They explored the use of sustainable materials when building new houses and buildings and talked about the carbon footprint of different materials, such as steel, concrete, incineration ash and soft woods. They used this new knowledge and a strict budget to design a new home, implementing green technologies into them. Depending on the locations of their houses, the children looked at what would work best. Some chose to have green roofs on their homes, wind turbines, triple glazed windows and grey water collection, while others looked at chimney balloons, solar panels or extra plants around their homes.

All of the class really enjoyed the workshop and the winning team will present their house at a celebration day at Salford University on the 1st of July.
